Individuals, as a normal part of their workplace duties, are required to work with team members to coordinate the required response to a fire emergency, select and use emergency equipment, and conduct search and rescue according to procedures.

Please read the AS/NZS 1715 Appendix B: Facial Seal of Respirators. Trainees will not be able to meet competency if they do not comply with the requirements of the standard. Please contact ERGT for further clarification if required.
